The small table above presents my current projection – unchanged from the time of our closing meeting in August – for our consolidated financial picture. I'll provide a complete recap with detailed financials in the spring Jibsheet.

You probably will recall that we usually report our financials in four “buckets” – operations, Capital Fund (the Alan McClennan Fund), 420 Fund, and Self-Insurance Fund. In reality, though, all of our money goes into one checking account at Cape Cod Five and one money-market fund at Fidelity.

Last year, we raised our rates, and the result was that our operating account will be solidly in the black – by \$10,000 or so – after three years of deficits totaling more than \$20,000. That's really good news. However, we had a lot of expenditures in our Capital Account, most notably for repairs to the bank, and that account will be about \$8,000 in the red. On top of that, we made the decision to purchase three new 420's from the 420 Fund, which will wind up the year about \$23,000 in the red. In total, therefore, we will wind up the year about \$21,000 in the red.

This is not a cause for panic – in fact, we knew this would happen when we made the decision to buy the 420's. Our rate increases did exactly what we needed them to do – put our operations solidly in the black – and our members continue to be most generous, making special donations of more than \$16,000 to our operating, Capital, and 420 funds. My thanks to all of you who made such a difference for the Club.

However, we need to be thoughtful about our capital needs as we approach our next year. We will soon need to make significant repairs to the dock; there are many improvements and repairs needed for the Clubhouse; there is always the danger of a nor'easter damaging the bank; and we need to implement a regular program of replenishing the 420 fleet.
